

3 The temporaries



Composite veneers... Critical, honest self-evaluation:

- Full series of images at veneer appt Load and evaluate
- Mark areas of needed improvement
- Make notes
- Print images for operatory or digital in operatory computer
- Do corrections then or see pt back in 1-2 weeks
- Enhancements as needed
