They must understand the expected outcome of each treatment and decide which is best for them. Each patient will use their own critique (cost, restoration like expectancy, aesthetics, etc...). Second, they or a legal representative must consent to the treatment, showing that they understand the risks involved and except them. Most importantly, the person much be mentally able to make the dreision.

2 g Americillin by IM or IV 1/2 hour before treatment.
